Mr. Wilensky announced that this was the August 23, 2011 Special Meeting of the Waterford School Building Committee which had just adjourned Executive Session and is resuming the Public Session.

VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Belair reported that we are opening school next Tuesday. They have been getting the high school ready for staff and students. Monday will be the kick off with all the staff at Clark Lane Middle School. There will be an opening convocation and an overview of the progress on the High School Project. They are also looking to the next meeting with plans for the Library design, and the modifications to the original design, while keeping in mind the importance of the 21st Century. We are hoping to have that on the Agenda for the next meeting.

The Technology Committee has been meeting on a regular basis and is at a point where they are trying to stay within the Budget for a completely wireless environment. Mr. Belair will keep us posted on the progress.

- 1. Replace existing plumbing fixtures in exterior toilet rooms A106 & A108. Work includes (9) toilet seats, (3) urinals, (11) Battery operated Sloan flush valve Kits in the amount of \$13,058.18. Excludes Patching.
- 2. Supply and install new Elevator Pit Ladder at Pool Elevator # 2 in the amount of \$1,731.00. This is required by code.
- 3. Per RFI 141 add Gypsum soffits/beam in fills at pool lobby stair to hide the exposed steel in the amount of \$3,006.31.

Discussion was started by Mr. Dembek regarding the netting. Should the netting be placed only at the end zone; or should be all the way around the field? There is a possibility that someone could be running on the track and could be hit by a ball. Also, there was discussion on whether posts were needed to hold the netting in place, and if inserts and sleeving would be used. Lacrosse and Track are scheduled at the same time of the year. It was decided to invite Mr. Dave Sousa to the next meeting to discuss his opinion on whether the netting should be all around the field, or just behind the goals. Discussion ended when it was decided to put this item on hold until the next meeting.

Discussion commenced on the Sewer line that was buried and did not show on the original plans when they started discussing the High School Project around April of 2007 per Mr. Wagner. Mr. Kotait recommended removing the manhole that is on the track and connecting the two pipes for a temporary fix. Discussion also ensued on the jet router in case the sewer line has a problem. Rerouting the sewer line to another location, and how that could be accomplished was also discussed. Discussion ended when it was agreed to put this item on hold until the next meeting.

There was no action on Items 7 and 8 at this time.

ix. WATERFORD HIGH SCHOOL

Construction Manager's Report: O & G

Mr. Kotait distributed copies of his Monthly Status Report #7. He reported that 43 geothermal wells are done. The bleachers for the football field are being installed at the home end. The West Side Drainage is completed and is ready for school to open next week. They are addressing fencing issues and egress issues around the building. Structural steel will start tomorrow. They are working on the bridge foundation. They are working on the footings for the West Canopy. They will be repaving the walkway at the end of the week.

They will start the flooring tomorrow. The painting of the pool has started. The old drains around the pool have been removed, and they are installing new ones. They are getting design information from the structural engineer regarding reinforcement under the pool deck. Things are progressing nicely.

Mrs. Nazarchyk asked about the dance floor. Mr. Ayles said that Ms. MacDougall saw the plans and liked what she saw.

Mr. Wilensky asked about paving the main parking area. Mr. Kotait said they will be paving it this week.

Mr. Dembek asked about the fencing around the baseball field. There is an issue regarding the 8 ft. fence vs. the 6 ft fence. Now that we have two size fences, what are we going to do with the fence that we are not going to use? Discussions ensued on whether the fence could be returned and the restocking fee paid, or whether it could be used on the south end of the field. The value of the fence will be determined by the next meeting, and a quote for the restocking fee to return the fence will be obtained.

Architect's Report Waterford High School: JCJ Architecture

Mr. Ayles reported that there were two things that happened since the last meeting; Jay Miner and he walked through the Maintenance Building to look at the spaces so they could get more detailed drawings. The Technology staff is working on the server location, the security system, and the fire alarm. The other thing that happened is that this morning there was a Code Blue Demonstration. People from Massachusetts set up three different types of security stations, and demonstrated the abilities on how it ties into the Police bands. Mr. Wilensky said that we are considering installing 4 Emergency Call Stations; one at the Soccer Field, Baseball Field, Football Field, and inside the school. They will be getting prices. This could enable parents, students, and faculty to be reached when they are on the fields and the games are going on.

Mr. Norton asked about the range of the speakers. The 4 speakers would be 100 db speakers in order to be heard by the public within 2,000 ft. They would be needed to reach people at the far end of the fields.

X. OSWEGATCHIE SCHOOL

There was no report

Mr. Dembek asked when the Oswegatchie Project would be closed. Mr. Wilensky said that Rudie Beers is the trigger to closing the projects. She will need to verify that all the contracts are fulfilled and all the bills are paid. Mr. Miner said that there are still a few issues to be resolved regarding Laminate issues, Millwork issues, and Playground issues. They are getting closer to closing the project because the Punch List is complete.

XI. GREAT NECK SCHOOL

There was no report.

XII. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Wilensky said that he would entertain a motion to enter into an agreement with a third party evaluator to examine the roof at Quaker Hill School not to exceed \$3,000.00.
